

# SUMMER COLLEGE MINISTRY DIRECTOR

## First Presbyterian Church Winston-Salem

### **What is the summer college ministry director position?**

It is a paid 10-week opportunity to gain ministry experience by working with students who are in Winston-Salem for the summer—primarily “away” students who were involved in 1<sup>st</sup> Pres but go to college elsewhere for the school year! The church cares deeply that these students stay engaged in their faith and desires to create a summer ministry that will allow them to grow in community, discipleship, and serving.

### **What will I be doing?**

The summer director will be responsible for creating opportunities for college students to engage with their faith over the summer:

- A “kick-off” activity to start the summer in mid-late May
- 2 to 4 fellowship/hang out opportunities
- At least one serving event or opportunity for college students to engage in
- An on-going Bible study, small group, or other discipleship program

You will receive coaching from the Youth Ministry staff and the Missions Pastor, as well as budget money to use for programs and contact work.

### **How will I know if I’m the right fit?**

The right person will have experience either leading or being heavily involved in college ministry, youth ministry, and/or missions and is looking for an opportunity to serve in a short-term ministry setting as a way to learn more about ministry. Interest in full-time ministry or missions is not required but is encouraged!

The ideal summer director will also have experience in a church like 1<sup>st</sup> Presbyterian, which sends students to several places that then come home for the summer.

- A brief statement of why you’re interested in the job and what you hope to gain from it.
- A brief statement of faith and explanation of your faith journey (what you believe about Jesus, salvation, etc. and how you came to believe it—three paragraphs or less).
- One reference letter from someone who’s seen you in action in a ministry context.
